Bonn is home to many experts working in the field of (forced) migration – in associations, international organizations, think tanks and universities. We pool this expertise in various active formats and expand it together, particularly in the area of transdisciplinarity.











The Bonn Platform for Forced Migration Studies is a collaboration established in 2023 by researchers and academic managers. It brings together bicc (Bonn International Centre for Conflict Studies), FFVT (Forced Migration and Refugee Studies: Networking and Transfer), the University of Bonn, and the Bonn Institute for Migration Research and Intercultural Learning (BIM e.V.), including its House of Diversity Migrapolis.

Through the platform, we foster a trusting exchange among experts from NGOs, international organizations, think tanks, and universities in the field of forced migration. We facilitate roundtable discussions for dialogue and collegial consultation in a young, transdisciplinary, and sensitive research area. Additionally, we contribute to institutional matters such as research ethics and the requirements of transdisciplinary work.

Activities

The platform regularly hosts **roundtables** to bring together researchers, practitioners and migrant self-organizations on (forced) migration. Our **IMPULSE Cafés** promote interdisciplinary dialog between researchers.

Milestones

The coordinating team collaborated in the 5th Conference of the German Network for Migration Studies in 2024 and in the International Days 2023 at the University of Bonn. Another major success was gaining funding for the project "Reflexivity in (Forced) Migration Studies" (2024–2025) from the Transdisciplinary Research Area (TRA), Individuals, Institutions, Societies' at the University of Bonn.

The initiative's member bicc is doing pioneering work in refugee policy by establishing a **Refugee Advisory Board for Germany** in cooperation with the Federeal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), the Federal Foreign Office and the Robert Bosch Foundation. The **national secretariat** will be hosted by bicc.
